## Principal's Report

## Setting Future Directions for Warragul North PS

Last Thursday, 16th October, Mrs Win Warren, our school reviewer, met throughout the day with a panel of representatives from our school community including our School Council President, Mr Chris Smith. This was a formal opportunity to meet with the school reviewer and provide input into the review process.

The day commenced with panel members sharing and celebrating the achievements of Warragul North Primary School over the life of the 2011-2014 school strategic plan. Survey results were also discussed.

The parent comments indicated their high regard for Warragul North Primary School. Parents liked the high quality teaching and learning, the sense of community and welcoming environment, the variety of extracurricular activities provided and the values that are instilled into students, who enjoy coming to school.

Many teachers commented on the professional supportiveness of their colleagues, the feelings of community and the high expectations for student achievement and behaviour.
The students appreciate their patient and caring teachers, making learning choices within the curriculum, the low incidence of bullying at Warragul North Primary School and enjoy developing friendships with their peers.
Our reviewer will return later this term to make a presentation to staff and School Council outlining her recommendations for our future plans. The review report that Mrs Warren will write will provide an objective and critical assessment of the school, but it will also recognise the school's achievements. The review report will reflect the context within which the school operates and the value it adds for students.

During the lunch break, Mrs Warren, the review panel members and the staff enjoyed lunch together. This gave the staff an opportunity to meet Mrs Warren.

# Count Us In! 

Learning music at school makes a unique contribution to children's development. There have been countless studies that have linked music learning to improved academic and social outcomes. With this in mind, consider that only $23 \%$ of Australian schools have a consistent, sequential and developmental music program.
'Music: Count Us In!' is a Federal Government initiative which started in 2007 to highlight this issue by having as many schools as possible, public and private, primary and secondary, singing a purpose written song (by secondary students) on the same day and same time across Australia. Last year over 600,000 children took part including over 500 from Warragul North Primary School.

Warragul North Primary School has been involved for the past four years and this year will again take part at 12.30 pm on Thursday 30th October, when the whole school will come together to sing, 'Paint You a Song', supported by our senior choir the Choristers and Warragul North's very own Rock Band Blitz .
