Warragul North Primary School has been chosen by the Baw Baw Shire and West Gippsland Healthcare Group to be part of the 2017 Walk to School campaign. They will develop 3 – 4 safe walking routes with specified start and end points. The aim is for children to recognise the paths and use them to get to school, rather than being dropped off at the school gate.

A pamphlet will be distributed to families of Warragul North Primary School with the designated walking routes clearly mapped. The school will also be eligible to be awarded vouchers if our proportion of children participating across the month of October is the highest in the shire.

Where once I was not quite sure what I would be doing as a chaplain, I now find myself with a full and busy schedule each day and a never ending to do list. And I love it. It is such a privilege to share in people's lives, particularly when kids, their families or staff open up and share with me some of the tougher aspects of life.

There are many ways to let me

know if you'd like me to catch up with you/your child. You may call the school or let the front office know via email or in person, or even put a note directly into my 'Request to see Mrs Cutler' box located under the photo board in the front office. Before I can meet with your child for a personal session I need a signed consent form which can be collected from the front office or can be sent home with your child. This only needs to be done once. Sometimes it's helpful for me to have a little background information, so a phone call, note or catch up in person is very helpful. Given the size of the school and my relatively short work hours, it is a juggling act of prioritising needs, so I really appreciate when an urgent need is communicated to me so I can shuffle my schedule to accommodate this.

I've also been enjoying running lunchtime activities. As these activities are quite casual in nature I allow students to attend without signed consent. If your child is wanting to participate in these, they need to put their name into the 'Request to see Mrs Cutler' box and I'll invite them to the next available lunchtime for their age group. Students can check the sign on my door to see when they have been invited to attend a lunch time activity.
