Well done to the 18 children who achieved 100% attendance for 2018. These students were presented with a 100% certificate at the mini-concert and Year Six Graduation assembly.

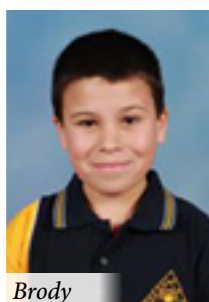
In primary school, some students **miss** on average **3 weeks** of school **per year**. That's **half a year** of school by the end of **year 6**.

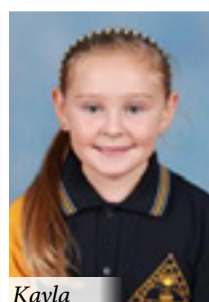

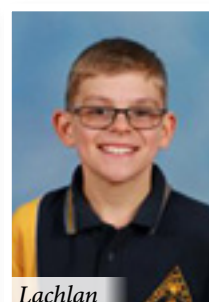

Environmental & Sustainability Group



Representatives from the co-sponsors of our school's worm farm, the Drouin & District Community Bank, attended our assembly on Friday 7th December. The Drouin & District Community Bank donated \$1,000 dollars towards the project, which is now in operation. This donation went towards the worm farm equipment, supplies and the construction of a new fence.

We have nine worm farms, with one more coming soon. These are taking the food scraps from three grades. As the worm populations build up, we will increase the amount of food scraps. Through this process, we hope to divert the 3.2 tonnes of organic waste our school sends to landfill each year.

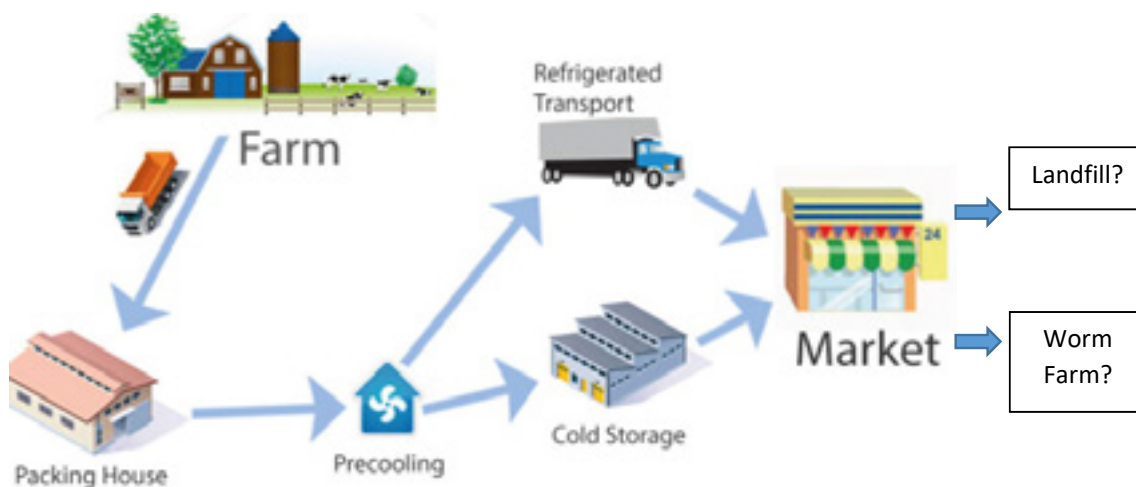

How can you can help at home?

Most of the food waste that goes into the worm farms is fruit. During our waste audit, we have discussed the chain of production of items we purchase. It would be good if you could discuss this with your child. It will save you money, and reduce pressure on the worm farms!

By sending students with smaller portions, or encouraging them to bring home fruit if uneaten/barely eaten – we can reduce the environmental impact of our food production and disposal. We also teach them how to be more sustainable in the future. Tip: the use of reusable containers and lemon juice can prevent fruit from discolouring (if sending smaller portions).
