OUTSIDE SCHOOL HOURS CARE

During the past two weeks children at OSHC sessions have enjoyed creating using recyclable boxes and packets. It is great to see what their imaginations come up with using boxes, sticky tape, scissors and a stapler.

Our focus with our Quality Improvement Plan is sustainability. Staff at OSHC attended the first session of a two part presentation on sustainability and gathered ideas that will be useful in ensuring our service is environmentally friendly. We have plans to create a play area in the back yard at the OSHC house using the natural environment. Staff from OSHC services in Baw Baw Shire meets once each term with a support person who assists with our Quality Improvement Plans. The next meeting is being held at the Warragul North Primary School OSHC house.



- ✓ <u>I Can Do It</u> thinking that I'm more likely to be successful than I am to fail.
- ✓ **Giving Effort** thinking that the harder I try, the more successful I will be, and knowing that success is not caused by external factors (luck, ease of task), but by internal factors (effort).
- ✓ Working Tough thinking that in order to be successful in the future, I sometimes have to do things that are not easy or fun in the present.










'Mr McGee And The Biting Flea' Excursion


