#### **Head Lice**

Head lice affects all families and is a pesky health issue. We need volunteers to assist our school community to help control any head lice problems. If you are able to volunteer please contact the school office. Training will be provided. Parents can participate according to their availability on a rostered basis. We are aiming to secure one to two volunteers per year level.

SCHOOL POLICY: If your child has untreated nits or lice, school policy requires parents/guardians be phoned and the child picked up from school as soon as possible. Contact with other children is not appropriate until a signed form is returned to the school office, advising the child's hair has been treated. You may treat the child's hair and return the child to school on the same day.

A follow up check will be conducted at school as soon as possible, to ensure treatment has been effective. If needed, parents / guardians will be contacted again to collect their child for re-treatment of the child's hair.

#### Medication

Parents are reminded that when sending medication to school this must be dropped at the office and a medication form completed to ensure the appropriate dosage is administered.

Please do not give any medication to students to keep in their bag in any circumstances.

# STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE / AMBULANCE COVER ARRANGEMENTS AND PRIVATE PROPERTY

Parents are reminded that the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development does not provide personal accident insurance or ambulance cover for students. Parents and guardians of students, who do not have student accident insurance/ ambulance cover, are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance / transport and any other transport costs.

Private property brought to school by students, staff or visitors is not insured and the Department does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage. This can include mobile phones, calculators, toys, sporting equipment and cars parked on school premises. Students and staff are discouraged from bringing any unnecessary or particularly valuable items to school.

#### EVERY DAY COUNTS

Primary school attendance



We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day.

Missing school can have a major impact on a child's future – a student missing one day a fortnight will miss four full weeks by the end of the year. By Year 10 they'll have missed more than a year of school.


There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes.

Coming to school every day is vital, but if for any reason your child must miss school speak with your child's classroom teacher and find out what work your child needs to do to keep up. Remember, every day counts. If your child must miss school, speak with your classroom teacher early as early as possible.

From 1 March 2014, new laws will mean that parents can be fined for not sending students to school without an acceptable reason.

If you're having attendance issues with your child, please let your classroom teacher know so we can work together to get your child to school every day.
