Principal's Report

A New Look for Student Reports at Warragul North Primary School

Our school has moved to a new system for reporting student progress. We will be using Sentral Education School and Student Management Software for midyear reports.

Parents will receive reports that contain information about their child's learning, attendance, personal qualities, behaviour and school activities.

Included with the report will be an English continuum and a Mathematics continuum

which informs parents about a student's achievement, current learning, and the next level of learning in English and Mathematics.

The reports will contain an A - E rating as directed by Department of Education and Early Childhood Development.

'Celebrate the C'. A 'C' rating will indicate that your child is performing at the expected standard and that there is little reason for concern about academic



progress. A 'B' rating shows achievement above the expected standard, and an 'A' indicates outstanding achievement. 'D' and 'E' ratings indicate that your child is below the expected standard and vou should discuss this with your child's teacher.

Shortly mid-year reports will be sent home with your child. Mid-year reports will be enclosed in a report folder which should be retained for storage of end of year reports. Only one folder will be sent home per year.

OUTSIDE SCHOOL HOURS CARE



RESILIENCE means knowing

how to stay calm and being able to stop yourself from getting extremely angry, down, or worried when something 'bad' happens. It means being able to calm down and feel better when you get very upset. It also means being able to control your behaviour when you are very upset so that you bounce back from difficulty and return to work or play.

Resilience Skills to Strengthen Resilience:

- ✓ Finding something fun to do.
- ✓ Finding someone to talk to.
- ✓ Relaxation.
- ✓ Exercise.
- Being assertive.
- Changing negative to positive self-talk.
- ✓ Not blowing things out of proportion.
- ✓ Figuring out how to solve the problem.

Rational Ways to Think to Increase Resilience:

✓ <u>It's Not as Bad as You Think It</u>

<u>**Is**</u> thinking – for example, "It's not the worst thing that could happen to me."

- ✓ <u>I Can Stand It</u> thinking for example, "I don't like it, but I can stand it."
- ✓ <u>Accepting Myself</u> thinking for example, "When I make mistakes or people don't want to be around me, I know that I am still okay. I am still me, capable and likeable."
- ✓ <u>Taking Risks</u> thinking for example, "It's OK to make mistakes when learning new things."
- ✓ <u>I Can Do It</u> thinking for example, "I'm more likely to be a successful than to fail."
- ✓ <u>Being Tolerant of Others</u> thinking – for example, "It is okay when people are different from me in custom or appearance."
- ✓ <u>Working Tough</u> thinking for example, "To achieve success, everyone has to do things they do not feel like doing."
