Year Six Graduation



It was a privilege to be a part of this exciting day and a great joy to see our Year Six students celebrating with their families.



The weather couldn't have been any better for the Year Six camp from Monday 4th to Wednesday 6th December. The students had three



School Costs 2024

The school costs for 2024 have been confirmed by the Warragul North Primary School Council.

The costs for 2024 will become active and appear on Compass prior to school commencing next year. Our preferred method of payment is via Compass.

SCHOOL COSTS 2024:

The school costs for the 2024 year as set by School Council are as follows:

STUDENT SUPPLIES FOUNDATION - YEAR SIX STUDENTS \$295.00 PER STUDENT

To ensure all Warragul North Primary School students have the essential stationery supplies needed for the academic year our School Council makes a bulk purchase from reputable suppliers on behalf of parents. This ensures the student's supplies are purchased effectively and easily. The bulk purchase also means all students have access to the same supplies (e.g. reading diary, pencils, pens, rulers, paper, paint, glue, etc).



Also included are the materials and equipment for our specialist subjects of Visual Arts, Performing Arts, L.O.T.E. (Japanese), S.T.E.M. (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) and Physical Education. On commencement, Foundation students will receive a Warragul North Primary School satchel, a whiteboard and headphones.



Students are provided with an exciting variety of online platforms dependant on their year level. The platforms for 2024 are being reviewed, but in the past we have used myOn, Wushka, MathsOnline, Mathletics, Phonics Hero, Literacy Planet and Ed Alive. These are educational websites that the children will use at school and also be able to access at home.

GROUNDS MAINTENANCE DONATION FOUNDATION - YEAR SIX STUDENTS \$25.00 PER STUDENT

The School Community are pro-active in seeing the school's buildings and grounds properly maintained in order to provide the students and staff with a clean, tidy and safe learning environment. To assist in achieving this goal the School Council invites families to make a donation to the school, suggested amount of \$25.00 per student, but families are welcome to contribute any amount they choose.

The support from families through parent payment allows Warragul North Primary School to deliver a variety of subjects and educational experiences to all students.



HEADLICE

A timely reminder to all families. Please use the forthcoming school holidays to check your child's hair for head lice. It is a good opportunity to get on top of this pesky problem. Thank you!

Treating and controlling headlice

While children are at school many families will have contact with head lice. The information contained here will help you treat and control head lice.

Catching head lice

Head lice have been around for many thousands of years. Anyone can get head lice.

Head lice are small, wingless, blood sucking insects. Their colour varies from whitish-brown to reddish-brown. Head lice only survive on humans. If isolated from the head they die very quickly (usually within 24 hours).

People get head lice from direct hair to hair contact with another person who has head lice. This can happen when people play, cuddle or work closely together.

Head lice do not have wings or jumping legs so they cannot fly or jump from head to head. They can only crawl.

Finding head lice

Many lice do not cause an itch, so you have to **look carefully to find them**.

Head lice are found on the hair itself and move to the scalp to feed. They have six legs which end in a claw and they rarely fall from the head. Louse eggs (also called nits) are laid within 1.5 cm of the scalp and are firmly attached to the hair. They resemble dandruff, but can't be brushed off.

Lice can crawl and hide. The easiest and most effective way to find them is to follow these steps:

- Step 1** Comb any type of hair conditioner on to dry, brushed (detangled) hair. This stuns the lice and makes it difficult for them to grip the hair or crawl around.
- Step 2** Now comb sections of the hair with a fine tooth, head lice comb.
- Step 3** Wipe the conditioner from the comb onto a paper towel or tissue.
- Step 4** Look on the tissue and on the comb for lice and eggs.
- Step 5** Repeat the combing for every part of the head at least four or five times.

If lice or eggs are found, the hair should be treated.

If the person has been treated recently and you only find empty hatched eggs, you may not have to treat, as the empty eggs could be from a previous episode.

Treating head lice

Treating head lice involves removing lice and eggs from the hair. There are two ways you can do this:

1. Buying and using a head lice lotion or shampoo, following the instructions on the product
2. Using the conditioner and comb method (described under 'finding head lice') every second day until there have been no live lice found for ten days.

If you choose to use a head lice product always read and follow the instructions provided with the product carefully. The following points may also be helpful:

- Head lice products must be applied to all parts of the hair and scalp.
- No treatment kills all of the eggs so treatment must involve two applications, seven days apart. The first treatment kills all lice; the second treatment kills the lice that may have hatched from eggs not killed by the first treatment.
- Cover the person's eyes while the treatment is being applied. A towel is a good way to do this.
- If you are using a lotion, apply the product to dry hair.
- If you are using a shampoo, wet the hair, but use the least amount of water possible.
- Apply the treatment near the scalp, using an ordinary comb to cover the hair from root to tip. Repeat this several times until all the hair is covered.

There is no need to treat the whole family - unless they also have head lice.

Concentrate on the head - there is no need to clean the house or the classroom.

Only the pillowcase requires washing - either wash it in hot water (at least 60°C) or dry it using a clothes dryer on the hot or warm setting.



fruit Christmas Tree

- 1 large pineapple
- 1 bunch green grapes—cut in half or quartered
- 1 bunch red grapes—cut in half or quartered
- 1 container strawberries—cut in half
- 1/4 watermelon
- toothpicks
- cookie cutters

Cut the top off of the pineapple and discard. Then, cut the pineapple into a cone shape like a tree. Use toothpicks to attach the fruit to the pineapple so it looks like a decorated tree. Use cookie cutters to make shapes out of the watermelon.
